**POOL** - During the 4<sup>th</sup> of July weekend, the pool restrooms were vandalized. If you have any information regarding this, please call KC Property at (248-586-9700) or email the Board of Directors. Every time vandalism occurs it costs us all to have someone clean up and replace broken equipment.

Please remember if you open an umbrella please close it when you leave.

**Irrigation** - Some timing issues developed with the sprinkler systems. This has been corrected.

**Northern Pines** has planted the replacement foliage for those plants which were destroyed by the 2014 and 2015 harsh winters. This June has been unusually dry, if your unit was a recipient of one or more of those new plants/shrubs please give them some water if needed.

During the road work, Northern Pines will not be cutting the lawn.

**Birmingham Sealcoating** – As road work begins, parking in designated parking areas will be strictly enforced. Emergency vehicles will need a clear roadway and vehicles found parked outside of a designated area will be towed for the safety of the community.

## Prescription Drug Drop Box now available 24/7

Due to the overwhelming response observed during the Drug Enforcement Agency's semi-annual Prescription Drug Drop Box program, the Canton Police Department has installed a permanent drop box for individuals to dispose of unused or expired prescription drugs.

The box is located in the lobby of the police department, and is accessible to the public every day, all day.

Restrictions to the drop box include pills only—no liquids or needles.

Drop offs are anonymous and free of charge



## POOL REGULATIONS

**SAFETY IS MOST IMPORTANT AND MUST BE PRACTICED BY ALL**

1. Children 12 and under, non-swimmers, or others unlikely to exercise mature judgment in health and safety matters, are not permitted to enter the pool area unless accompanied by a resident adult charged with the responsibility for their safety and conduct. **REMEMBER – THERE IS NO LIFE GUARD ON DUTY.**
2. Floating devices or other objects, which may pose a hazard or hinder efficient use of the pool, will not be permitted.
3. Running, boisterous or rough play, ball throwing, diving or other accident prone and disruptive activities are not permitted.
4. Glass containers of any kind are not permitted within the enclosure area.
5. No food may be brought into the pool enclosure.
6. Alcoholic beverages of any type are strictly prohibited in the pool area.
7. In consideration of the residents living in proximity of the pool, amplified sound equipment is not to be used in the pool area.
8. Persons under the influence of alcohol or other intoxicants will be denied access to the pool area.

### CLEANLINESS AND HEALTH

1. Immediately prior to entering the pool, patrons shall take a cleansing shower using warm water and soap followed by a thorough rinse. Persons who leave the pool to use the toilet facilities should take another shower before returning to the water.
2. Persons using the pool must be attired in clean, bona fide swimwear. "Cut-off" jeans or trousers, tee shirts, or street socks are not acceptable.
3. Suntan lotions must be showered off before entering the water.
4. Persons wearing bandages or suffering from infectious or communicable diseases shall not use the pool.
5. Spitting, spouting of water, blowing the nose or otherwise polluting the pool water or deck area is forbidden.
6. Children who are not toilet trained must wear a clean diaper and tight fitting plastic pants. Any pool accidents by small children will require the closure of the pool area, per the Wayne County Health Department.
7. To minimize traffic and dirt around the pool, residents or guests in street clothes or shoes should not be in the pool area unless supervising swimmers.
8. Pets are not allowed within the pool enclosure fence.
9. Please be courteous! Pick up after yourself! This is your facility. Please treat it with the care and respect you have for your own property
